Susan Mencini - Suggested Supply List

- Experimental Acrylics and Design

*IF you have never painted with fluid acrylics and have heavy bodied or tubed acrylics you can use those. BUT if you have none and are buying paint, buy the fluids or soft bodied.

BARE BASICS:

Paint: white + 1 warm and cool each of blue, red, and yellow Brushes (3): rigger, no. 8 round, 3/4" flat – soft synthetic

Watercolor paper to paint on, at least 140 lb, no smaller than 11x14

A support 'board', Masonite or Plexiglas

Welled Palette OR good substitutes are egg cartons, silicone lidded ice cube tray,

Styrofoam or paper plates

Spray bottle for water

Miscellaneous

Paper Towels

'The Masters' Brush Cleaner Sketch pad/pencil(s)

91% Rubbing alcohol/small mist bottle

Paints – use either

Liquitex Soft Body OR Golden fluids

Titanium White Titanium White in Matte Heavy Body Acrylic

Alizarian Crimson Quinacridone Crimson
Azo Yellow Nickel Azo Yellow

Cadmium Red Medium Cadmium Red Medium Hue

Cadmium Yellow Medium Benzimidazolone Yellow Medium (Cadmium Yellow Medium Hue)

Cerulean Blue Chromium

Ultramarine Blue Ultramarine Blue

Benzimidazolone Yellow Light (Hansa Yellow Light)

Extra colors but not necessary:

Cobalt Blue Anthraquinone Blue

Hookers Green Gold

Quinacridone Nickel Azo Gold Quinacridone Magenta

Other brands of fluid acrylics include DaVinci, Utrecht and Holbein

All can be ordered on line at Dick Blick, Jerry's Artarama or Cheap Joes.

Locally Michaels and JoAnn's sell Golden Paints; Michaels sells Liquitex as well

Hobby Lobby sells an air-tight welled palette that I use.

I paint on Strathmore Aquarius II 80lb watercolor paper, which I buy in bulk on line.

My favorite brush is from Michaels: Artist's Loft Vienna 3/4" flat.
