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WATERCOLOR SUPPLY LIST

Please keep in mind that you really don't need much to start with! Other paints, papers and brushes can be added as your proficiency increases.

PAPER

<u>Practice paper...</u>I have found this paper to be inferior and will impede your progress Strathmore makes a pad of 140# watercolor paper, 12" x 18", 12 sheets, Catan's, Use this pad only if you are a true beginner...it lifts far too easily

Good paper

Arches, 140#, hot or cold press (I prefer cold press)

Winsor-Newton, 140#, hot or cold press

These sheets are 22" x 30", and can be cut into halves or quarters (11 x 15)

(A few of my students use 300# paper which is quite thick and never ever needs
to be taped or clipped....it sucks up lots of paint and handles quite differently from 140#)

Other papers I enjoy are: Strathmore Gemini and Fabriano Artistico...these need to be ordered

BRUSHES

There are millions, billions, trillions or brushes...kolinsky sables are the finest and most expensive, and synthetics are hard to work with because they don't hold much paint. The "blends", a combination of sable and synthetic and a great compromise, easy to work with and reasonable in price.
YOU WILL NEED ONLY THREE BRUSHES FOR THIS CLASS

*one - #12 round
Approximately
Cotman synthetic #12 round, Catan's,
*one – 1" flat, preferably with a beveled handle, Catan's,
*one – 2" hake brush for washes, very inexpensive

PAINT

I use Winsor & Newton and Daniel Smith professional grade paints in 15 ml. Tubes...they are also the most expensive.

Winsor & Newton also makes a student grade paint called "Cotman"...

Permanent Carmine, Cadmium Red, Opera Rose, Rose Madder Genuine, Cadmium Yellow, Cadmium Yellow, Pale, Winsor Yellow, Naples Yellow, Transparent Yellow, Hooker Green Sap Green, Cerulean Blue, Cobalt Blue, French Ultramarine, Phthalo Turquoise, Winsor Blue Raw Sienna, Burnt Sienna, Yellow Ochre, Raw Umber, Burnt Umber Brown Madder Alizarin, Sepia

Cheap Joe colors: Halloween Orange, Andrew's Turquoise

*try to get at least 5 colors, including a yellow, a red, and a blue

<u>Note</u>: No one needs all of these colors. I don't need all of these colors. Paints are rated according to permanency and transparency. As you progress, you will find out which colors appeal to your needs and to your personal sense of aesthetics.

*OTHER NECESSARY SUPPLIES

pencils kneaded erasers palette(mine is Robert Wood), large jar or container for water(plastic is best) support for painting – basswood or masonite, approximately 18" x 22" paper towels – New Viva is great

paper towels – N spray bottle sketchbooks mat knife
