ALL CITY ART WALK - ART PAVES THE WAY!

Art created by Cuyahoga Falls' students in grades K-12 was exhibited during this year's Art Walk held on Thursday, April 19th. The Art Walk not only included amazing student art, but also music, photo booths, make-it-and-take-it activities, food and interactive art projects all spread throughout downtown Cuyahoga Falls.

The Cuyahoga Valley Art Center – advocating for a greater understanding of the visual arts through the promotion of art education, exhibition and community engagement – opened their doors to the event planners of the Art Walk for two days. Wednesday, April 18th, CVAC cleared their gallery walls and students were able to begin hanging their artwork for the event. For many students, this was their first experience displaying in an art exhibition. Via the recommendation of CVAC's Director, a preview party was then held that evening on the gallery level to promote the event and raise money for the following year. At the party, students gave screen printing demonstrations by printing on bandannas that were then sold to the attendees.

During the Art Walk, students exhibited over 150 pieces of art within CVAC's gallery. Three local artists offered art demonstrations during the event and even had the students create art with them. On the lower level, students worked together to create and sell exclusive 2018 Art Walk tee shirts designed by Cuyahoga Falls High School's Art Club. This free event drew over 1500 people to CVAC and downtown Cuyahoga Falls in support of the arts.




ART JOURNALING & ALTERED BOOKS

An art journal or altered books often contains words, sketches and mixed media / collage elements as a form of creative expression. Our instructor has discovered that art journaling, beneficial for everyone, promotes out-of-the-box thinking and increases participants mark-making skills. Artistic skills are a plus however, unnecessary for this 2-day workshop as it is focused on fun techniques and processes for participants of all levels. Students will have the opportunity to create doors, windows and pockets within their books whilst creating unique textures by cutting, tearing and adding. Old photographs will be used to create tintypes to intermingle with additional ephemera. The workshop is designed to spark your creative engines and move forward with the skills to continue working independently.

Student will be required to bring their own supplies, including scissors, an old book to work within, old photographs to copy for tintypes, additional ephemera etc. If a student is looking to make an art journal, they are



encouraged to bring in left over artwork – the kind that is not good enough to throw away, yet not good enough to frame. They will also need to bring in 9" x 12" watercolor paper to create the journal. Class size is limited.

A CONVERSATION WITH CHRIS MORROW

March 2018: I had the privilege of getting to know fellow artists and CVAC member, Chris Morrow. Chris has been a part of the CVAC artistic community for a number of years, exploring acrylic media and collage, under the direction of Susan Mencini. However, Chris finds her true artistic passion within photography.

Inspired by her father William Jordan, who made his living as a photographer, Chris began her artistic journey via the purchase of a Minolta camera in 1984. Chris enjoyed traditional darkroom development until she replaced her chemical darkroom with a computer and digital software in 2001. "Once I acquired the computer and the software, I had the needed tools, but skill was another matter. The computer skills I've acquired have been through video tapes, magazines, sharing information with others and spending every free moment experimenting. It is all about learning through doing and allowing my imagination free reign. For the majority of my 'digital darkroom' images, my photos are combined with digital paint media to produce images that lie somewhere between the two artistic expressions." Chris

stated that she enjoys photographing "everything: landscapes, still life arrangements and people - all with a preference for natural light."

As a second generation photographer and accomplished mixed media artists, Chris has exhibited in juried, group and solo shows, winning a number of awards. Though photography has been her primary artistic outlet, regardless of the materials she uses, she finds enjoyment in the experience of seeing her creations evolve.

LINCOLN ELEMENTARY STUDENTS' LEADER IN ME TREE

The students of Lincoln Elementary collaborated as a team to create their *Lincoln Leader In Me Tree* tryptic (3-part) mural. The three panels come together to make one large tree adorned with 6 distinctly colored leaves. Each leaf represents one student of Lincoln Elementary, color coded by grade level. During the reception on February 23rd, a group of fifth grade students, representing the school's Lighthouse Team, gave a presentation to introduce and explain the mural panels and their creation. Visual Arts Instructor, Sara Farkas, was very proud of her students for working so well together on such a large project. These mural panels will hang in City Hall until the week of April 16th. After that they will be returned to Lincoln Elementary where they will be permanently installed within their school auditorium just in time for their May art show.



"WHAT LIFTS YOU?" A DEWITT MURAL

This vibrant set of wings set on a black background is a tryptic (3-part) mural created by third and fifth grade students at DeWitt Elementary. Under the guidance of art teacher Kat Skoff, students used their knowledge of tinting paint to create their own ombre feather, complete with surface designs and details using white oil pastel and black colored pencil. This collaborative mural is based on the work



of street artist Kelsey Montague, who creates intricate, large scale drawings of wings on the sides of buildings and invites people from all walks of life to stand in front of them and consider what lifts them. DeWitt Elementary students ask you to stand in front of the wings they assembled as a collaborative school project, and ask, *What lifts you? What brings you joy? What makes your heart soar?*" On display from April 16th through July 16th in Cuyahoga Falls City Hall.

WHISKEY PAINTERS OF AMERICAN EXHIBITION & ART SALE

The Whiskey Painters of America (WPA) have been invited to participate in the 36th Whiskey Painters of America Exhibition and Art Sale at CVAC, from April 24th - May 24th. This popular annual exhibition opened on Tuesday April 24th, kicking off the People's Choice selection process. We invited the public to participate in our People's Choice voting process that selected the top ten best of show paintings on display. This voting will concluded during the public reception held on Friday, May 11th from 4:30-7:30 pm in the main gallery.

This exhibition displayed the largest collection of Whiskey Paintings for sale in one location in the world. A Whiskey Painting is a watercolor miniature, no larger than 4" x 5" in size and is created by dipping one's paintbrush in some form of alcoholic spirits instead of water. Whiskey Paintings, the perfect décor for your home or office, generally sell for a minimum of \$75 to as high as \$1500, with the average selling price between \$150 and \$300. The WPA was officially established in 1962, at Tangier Night Club in Akron, Ohio to promote the fine art of painting in miniature. To become a member of this exclusive organization, an applicant must first have a bona-fide member of the WPA as a sponsor. The Whiskey Painters of America is the most unique and exclusive miniature painting society in the world.'

FACULTY SPOTLIGHT: JACK MULHOLLEN

Watercolor has always lent itself to outdoor painting, which I frequently did for many years, traveling to some of the great artist's locations and has given me some of the most wonderful memorable experiences I have ever had. But, today, I find myself in my studio more often where I have more control. The paintings perhaps are better, but I do miss the excitement of being outdoors on location.

Watercolor... it's what I do. The more I discover about it, the more I wish to learn, which keeps the excitement flowing.

I would define my style as "Expressionistic Realism with Controlled Spontaneity".

Favorite artist: Phillip Jameson, a Pennsylvania artist who spends the winter months in his studio there, painting mostly rural snow landscapes devoid of direct sunlight [which is much harder to paint than snow scenes filled with sun and shadows]. He is a master at this, much like Andrew Wyeth, and I am lucky to own several of his works which I find myself intently studying, trying to find out how he gets such beautiful effects sans sunlight... More and more I find myself trying to emulate this mood.



ARTIST SPOTLIGHT: MARK GIANGASPERO

Congratulation to our very own Mark Giangaspero for taking first place with his pastel portrait *Altered Identity* at the *Artists of Rubber City's 28th Annual Juried Show.* Anderson Turner, of the Akron Beacon Journal, described the piece as a "detailed grayscale portrait - fold of skin, freckles and body hair are all included – is quietly haunting." Turner believed that the work "shows off the personality of the subject and while there isn't an 'attitude' portrayed, you come away feeling like you can see something of the inner thoughts of the subject, which is part of what makes it so strong."

Less than one month later, Giangaspero submitted two additional pastel portraits into *Group Ten's 5th Annual Regional Juried Art Exhibition*, where he also took first place for his pastel portrait *Altered Identity II.* Kelly Maile of the Record Courier commented that Giangaspero's submissions "stand out in the show" due to his use of a "striking blue background" and placement of color.

Giangaspero has been a part of CVAC for a number of years now. As a Faculty member, he was gracious enough to share these pieces as works in progress with his students before these exhibitions. We recognized the beauty of his *Altered Identity* series within our classroom space, it is just fantastic that the rest of our arts community recognized it too.

Congratulations to new CVAC Member, Keith Wisdom for being accepted into the *Group Ten Annual Regional Juried Art Exhibition*. His smile says it all!
